

Manfred Gerstenfeld was born in 1937 in Vienna, grew up in Amsterdam from 1938 and moved to Israel in 1968 from Paris. He holds a PhD in environmental studies from Amsterdam University. Dr. Gerstenfeld is a chemist and an economist. He also holds a high-school teaching degree in Jewish studies from the Dutch Jewish Seminary. For forty years he has been an international consultant, specializing in business strategy and corporate analysis.

During his professional career spanning forty years, he has been an international consultant on business strategy issues. His clients have included chief executives or board chairmen of several of the world's largest multinational companies, as well as governments. He has been a non-executive Board member of the Israel Corporation and various other Israeli public companies. He is a Member of the Board of Fellows of the Jerusalem Center for Public Affairs, of which he was the Chairman from 2000 to 2012.

Dr. Gerstenfeld has authored fifteen books and edited five, which have been published in seven languages. A number of these concern anti-Semitism and post-Holocaust issues. He has also published articles in many leading papers and journals in various countries on political, economic, environmental, religious and historical subjects.
