

Dr. Jérôme Segal, is an Assistant Professor at the University Paris-Sorbonne, currently on a leave of absence to work as [coordinator](#) of a Ph.D. College at the University of Vienna. First trained as an engineer, Jérôme Segal also completed a Ph.D. in the field of history and philosophy of science, which resulted in a book (2003, [new edition in 2011](#)). He holds a tenure position at the University of Paris-Sorbonne. On leave from the University of Paris-Sorbonne, Segal came to Austria in 2004. In Vienna, he worked for three years as an Attaché at the French Embassy. He taught philosophy at the University of Vienna, and worked for three years on a European project in the field of cultural sociology. Segal also taught French and sociology (at the University of Vienna) and in 2011, began coordinating the Ph.D. College "[The Sciences in Historical, Philosophical and Cultural Contexts](#)". His current research project is on the history of Jewish entrepreneurs who invested in the Galician oil business around 1900 and their fates when they migrated to Vienna.
